As we reflect on the last 6 weeks, we are filled with awe at the goodness and faithfulness of our Heavenly Father. First and foremost, we are overjoyed to announce the birth of our fourth son, Luka! Truly, God has blessed us with this precious gift.



In the Psalm 127:3 says, "Children are a heritage from the Lord, offspring a reward from him." Luka's arrival has brought so much light and joy into our home, reminding us of the pure and boundless love our Father has for His children. Your encouragement has been a source of strength and joy for us as we embrace the adventure of raising four boys. We are deeply grateful for your prayers and support during this season of our lives.

Thank you for sharing in our joy and for standing with us in faith. Your prayers and love mean the world to us, and we look forward to seeing how God's hand will continue to move in Luka's life and in our family.









In addition to this joyous news, we are thrilled to share that our son Aaron is recovering remarkably well from his broken arm. However, the journey wasn't without its challenges. Just two weeks after the break, a follow-up X-ray revealed that Aaron's bone was not healing properly, and there was a risk that it could set incorrectly. The doctors strongly recommended surgery to re-align the bone and start the healing process anew. We were devastated and filled with fear at the prospect of such a major intervention.

But in that moment of fear and uncertainty, we turned to God in prayer, seeking His guidance and wisdom. We also sought advice from other medical professionals and, after much prayer and consideration, we felt led to take a step of faith and decline the surgery. Isaiah 41:10 became our anchor during this time. We chose to trust in God's power to heal, believing that He would work through Aaron's body to bring about the necessary healing.

After six weeks of wearing a cast, the moment of truth came when the cast was removed. We were anxious but hopeful, clinging to the promise that God was in control. The first words from the doctor were nothing short of miraculous: "It's a good thing you didn't go through with the surgery. The bone is healing beautifully on its own." This was a moment of profound relief and overwhelming gratitude. We witnessed firsthand the healing hand of God at work, defying expectations and bringing about a recovery that could only be described as miraculous.

Aaron's healing journey has strengthened our faith and reminded us of the power of trusting in God, even when circumstances seem dire.









We also had the blessing of spending a short, refreshing vacation by the sea. In those moments of rest, we felt the gentle whisper of God's peace and renewal wash over us, much like the waves on the shore. Acts 3:19 reminds us of the times of refreshing that come from the Lord, and we are so thankful for the way He refreshes our souls and renews our strength for the journey ahead.

On the academic front, I recently completed another session at my Christian university, and I'm now preparing for the upcoming autumn. As I continue my studies, I'm reminded of Colossians 3:23: "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters." It is my prayer that these efforts will be used for His glory and to further His kingdom.

And another joyful event - we celebrated our wonderful David's first anniversary! Ten years flew by in a flash, filled with bright colors, laughter and unforgettable moments. This anniversary became a moment of deep gratitude and joy for us. We remember how much has happened over the years and how much God has blessed our family. Some of you remember how we watched his first steps together, heard his first words? Time flies so quickly, and our friendship becomes stronger every year.











Ministry : We were blessed to participate in a powerful evangelization event in a park in Chișinău. This outreach was an incredible opportunity to share the love of Christ with those who may not have heard the Gospel before. We went and told the Gospel first, and then we invited these people to a program where there were songs of praise, a sermon and other things

As we ministered, we saw firsthand the transformative power of God's Word. Hearts were softened, and lives were touched in ways that only the Holy Spirit can accomplish. The presence of God was palpable, and it was evident that He was at work, drawing people to Himself.

We hold fast to the promise in Isaiah 55:11. This Scripture has been our anchor, reminding us that every word spoken, every prayer lifted, and every act of love has eternal significance. We trust that the seeds sown during this event will yield a bountiful harvest for His kingdom, bearing fruit that will last for generations.

aged 16-25. This camp presents a unique and blessed opportunity to live in close community with these young people for several days. During this time, we have the privilege of witnessing to the Gospel, encouraging believers in their faith, and sharing the hope of Jesus with those who may not yet know Him. The atmosphere of fellowship, worship, and teaching creates a space where hearts are open and ready to receive God's Word.

We ask for your prayers that this camp will be a life-changing experience for all who attend. Our deepest hope is that these young people will encounter Jesus in a powerful way, that their faith will be strengthened, and that they will leave with a renewed commitment to live for Him.



And from August 15th to 18th, we partnered to host a conference for pastors and leaders of home churches and groups. The theme of the retreat was "Healthy Church," and we firmly believe that it was a powerful time of growth in our understanding of God's purpose for the Church and a renewal of our strength for ministry. God's presence was profoundly felt among us, opening new horizons and inspiring us to pursue new heights in our faith.

During this retreat, we were reminded of the vital importance of building a Church grounded in God's truth and love. The fellowship, prayers, and reflections bore incredible fruit: pastors and leaders were deeply encouraged, and many gained a fresh perspective on their calling and ministry. In an atmosphere of unity and mutual support, we gained a clear understanding of what it means to be a healthy Church, fulfilling God's purpose here on earth.

Prayer Request: We ask for your continued prayers for the pastors and leaders who participated in this retreat. Pray that God strengthens them in their faith and grants them wisdom in applying everything they have learned. May the seeds sown in their hearts bear abundant fruit in their ministries and the lives of their congregations.
